Leonia's Postal Service.

To the Editor of The New York Times:

How postal "surpluses" are achieved: First-class mail from Newark, N. J., to Leonia, N. J., two days. Second class from Philadelphia to Leonia, four days; from Pleasantville, N. Y., five days; postal package (watch) from Waterbury, Conn., six days. Street corner collections from Grand Avenue and Christie Heights Street, Leonia, nominally every afternoon at 3:30; if carrier has no mail to deliver in that block letters may wait there three or four days. Letters from Leonia to New York go via Hackensack. Postal packages from Leonia to Coytesville, N. J., about three miles, go via Jersey City. Air mail first class from Los Angeles to New York arrives same day as ordinary mail posted same time.
